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Exam rooms provide acoustical and visual privacy, are scheduled, and have equipment and supplies readily available. Ideally, they are designed to be more human-centered place for care professionals to interact with their patient and family members.

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Exam rooms, located adjacent to the caregiver work areas, provide acoustical and visual privacy, are scheduled, and have equipment and supplies readily available. Ideally, they are designed to be more human-centered place for care professionals to interact with their patient and family members.

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In this expression of an Exam Room Setting, the layout promotes the proficiency of the caregiver, while allowing the patient and family member to sit together. Compass offers a monitor arm to ease information sharing and convenient places for storing supplies. A nearby tool rail keeps instruments accessible. As future needs require changes, Compass easily adapts.

This area is designed to support the work of caregivers and allow them to balance competing needs for concentration and collaboration, for face-to-face and digital communication, and for privacy and visibility.

In this work area, there are individual spaces that offer the ability to focus, that include supportive ergonomics, that keep technology within arm's reach, that provide for organizing materials while still retaining a measure of visibility to other caregivers. There are also areas that support informal exchanges and impromptu gatherings as well as intentional conversations. Even with a sense of territory and some privacy, caregivers are visible to colleagues and have open sight lines to exam rooms. There is the ability to adapt, as well, so caregivers can make changes to their environment as workflow and processes change.

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Welcome & Waiting

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Here patients and their guests are welcomed and the tone is set for the experience they will receive. These areas support a diverse range of populations and health conditions, consider privacy, and provide amenities as a point of attraction.



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The aim of these areas is to enhance the patient journey. Wayfinding is clear to reduce stress. Postural choice and variety accommodate the activities of patients and family, young and old, the able-bodied and people with disabilities. Support is provided for both traditional check-in and self check-in at seated and standing heights.

Product placement helps to define flow, and acts as a barrier for some visual privacy. Amenities allow for guest hospitality and personal accommodation and support the caregiver in hosting patients and their families.

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Consultation Area

In team-based care clinics, most interactions between providers and patients do not require a physical examination. The arrangement and furnishing of the consultation room is designed to promote communication and patient engagement.

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These rooms in team-based clinics provide comfortable spaces to consult with patients, when they are leaving their appointment or when they are attending a follow-up. Research has shown that patients are more engaged and willing to act on a care plan when interactions occur in a more consultative setting, rather than in a traditional exam room. Providing these consultation rooms has the added benefit of reducing the overall footprint needed for the clinic. Typically, clinics are using at least a one-to-one consultation room to exam room ratio, although other ratios are also being tested.

The layout shown here emphasizes administrative work and consultation versus examining or treating a patient. A work surface provides ample work area while the table and chair grouping is a place for casual conversation. The seating puts the caregiver at the same level as patients to signal empathy and equality. Video technology allows information sharing, while analog tools, such as markerboard and tackboard, provide a place for community health information.

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Urgent Care

With the growing needs of healthcare systems to lower costs, the Urgent Care clinic has risen as both a necessity for healthcare systems and for patients. Having access to a clinic is crucial to providing a full continuum of care for communities.

While similar in many respects to a primary care clinic, the urgent care clinic requires a diverse set of products and spaces to accommodate changing needs throughout the day. This example, while not comprehensive, is one possible scenario for an urgent care clinic that provides primary care services and addresses episodic needs for patients.

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Caregiver Core

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The caregiver core must be designed to support individual and collaborative work with the respect to patient privacy.

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The Caregiver Core area features multiple types of workspaces that support both collaboration and concentration. This configuration minimizes the distance between caregivers and allows for optimal communication.

The curved ends of the workstations create a semi-private touchdown location for interaction between caregiver and the patient or a family member.

The combination of workspaces and varying height panels naturally create opportunities for more heads down tasks such as documentation, private emails, or phone calls.

The center workspaces provide the ability to adjust to the appropriate height specific to the individuals task. The center arrangement also allows for a brief huddle between caregivers without needing to leave the caregiver core.

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Caregiver Core

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The caregiver core must be designed to support individual and collaborative work with the respect to patient privacy.

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The Caregiver Core area features multiple workstations that support both collaboration and concentration. The boundaries are blurred to accommodate a variety of uses of the space. The front of the Caregiver Core space allows for interaction between staff and patients. The back of the space provides areas where caregivers can achieve focused, individual work. Privacy screens provide a barrier between caregivers and patients, while allowing caregivers to face each other.

- Providing space for specialty carts to be brought in and placed to allow for efficient workflow for caregivers

The room is designed to draw focus to the consult space rather than the exam table; promoting patient engagement. Along with a family member, all are seated at eye level to focus attention on information and education, through use of the monitor.

The space supports family engagement by providing seating options in the room for up to 2 additional family members, along with ample storage for their belongings.

This room also supports the caregivers' needs along with by accommodating the caregivers' tools and supplies within arms reach from consult space, and allowing space for portable supplies to be brought in and/or closer to exam chair.

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The Welcome and Reception areas are the most commonly used spaces for patients and their families. The design of this space must make comfort and support a top priority.

> Reception and waiting areas provide valuable support for patients and their families. To minimize stress and anxiety, reception desks are visible upon entry. The reception area must support all aspects of patient check-in, including registration and guided check-ins for those who are are physically disabled or need help with reading, writing, or translation.

> Waiting areas typically feature a variety of seating types and arrangements to allow patients and families to find the area that's most comfortable for them. The variety as well as varying heights of furniture helps create different zones within an open space. The free flowing Steps seating immediately creates an inviting feel, while also providing flexibility to change as the facility needs.

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Dedicated semi-private spaces allow for private work, scanning, and check-out. Placing these areas separate from other workspaces emphasizes that the support and comfort of the patient and family are top priority.

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Physicians Alleys / Semi Private

Physicians' alleys and semi-private spaces must be designed to support privacy for caregivers.

Physicians' alleys are ideal for caregivers who need privacy when reading X-rays or accomplishing sensitive work.

Physicians' alleys are not fully enclosed rooms, but are unassigned, discreet areas that provide caregivers convenient places to get work done. This "alley" is an extension of the Caregiver Core.

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Shared Engagement Spaces

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As clinics seek to increase effectiveness and patient engagement, they seek to move beyond the examination or consult room with patients. Having a library or resource center, particularly for chronic or pre-chronic conditions, is more common. Formerly, these resource centers were just in the waiting or exam room, but clinics are now setting aside spaces for a separate "library" or resource center. In these spaces, a patient can be directed to look for certain material on their own, or assisted by a staff member as appropriate.

In addition to providing a resource center for individual patients, this new space can also be used for group patient encounters. A new model to increase effectiveness and encourage patients to look to each other for help and support with similar conditions is the shared medical appointment. In this model a group of patients with a similar condition—say, diabetes—are all invited in as a group, typically in the early evening. A half a dozen or so individuals may engage with a coaching session with a nutritionist, or group counseling session. Over the course of the shared appointment, another clinician may pull one of the patients out periodically for taking vitals, testing, or individual counseling.

A shared appointment is:

- Typically from 4-14 individuals, meeting after "work" hours
- Enhanced, intensive behavioral education
- Used 2-6 hours per week

Creating "pods" within a more open area with furniture for this type of space is beneficial for being able to be flexible to support the actual throughput. Everything in this space is modular, moveable, and interchangeable, so the lab can be rearranged quickly-without downtime or disruption. There are many furniture elements that can be combined to create these settings maintaining the privacy and dignity of the patient.
